They are waterproof and can be slept in. It allows staff to recognise any important head injury symptoms the next days as well in school.

Staff have noticed that the next day – wrist bands have been taken off

For some individuals with SEND and Sensory needs – we are exploring other options other than wrist bands.

Use of Fidget Toys: If children have fidget toys in class for a specific reason, please can they use school fidget toys rather than one from home. Any issues please contact Miss Rosario.

Currently, around 25% of our children either have a neurodiverse diagnosis or are on the pathway towards receiving one.

To help support families, we are delighted to be hosting a Neurodiversity Workshop for parents on **Thursday 25th June at 2:15pm** in school. The session will be led by our local Educational Psychologist and will explore some of the signs of neurodiversity, as well as practical strategies that can be used to support children at home.

WHAT THE NEW RULES MEAN FOR ME

I'm a single parent of one child and we want to go on holiday for a week

Your holiday will not be authorised and you must talk to the school before you book anything.

Because your child will miss 5 school days you will be given a penalty notice fine.

The fine is £160 but if you pay it within 21 days it will be reduced to £80

IRREGULAR ATTENDANCE

10 IN 10

If your child is absent for 10 or more sessions in 10 weeks and their absences are unauthorised, the school will consider prosecution

1 day = 2 sessions

THIRD TIME

A penalty notice fine will not be given.

Instead your case will be taken to court.

A magistrate can fine each parent £2,500 for each child.

1 parent & 4 children = £10,000

2 parents & 4 children = £20,000
