Policy For Remote Learning

Overview

This policy sets out the strategy that the school will use in the event of it having to send pupils home due to outbreaks of infection or any other need for remote learning

For those pupils who need to work at home and those who are isolating, the school will do all that it can, within its resources, to ensure that they can learn successfully at home.

However, the school has a priority to keep all children in school so that they have face to face learning as a priority.

Aims:

The definition of **remote learning** for our school in the new climate from February 2022 is for children learning outside of school and completing work independently.

This policy is aimed at :

Children who are self-isolating for 5 days due to a positive Covid test and until they are able to produce two negative LFT tests. This follows the latest national guidance. This period could last up to 10 days.

If family members are tested positive, then as long as the pupil remains symptom free and has a daily negative LFT then they should still attend school.

There may be the exceptional occasion where all the family have tested positive and they have no other means as to get the child to school.

Objectives

1. The school will do all that it can, within its resources, to ensure that those pupils who are isolating from school can continue to learn successfully at home and complete relevant school work.
2. The school will make every endeavour within its resources, to offer appropriate support to those with SEND and ECHPs
3. It will liaise with appropriate agencies to maintain the specialist support that some pupils may need.

Learning Work Packs

1. To maintain the learning of the curriculum the school will provide pupils with appropriate tasks and work to carry out at home relevant to their work in school in the form of a work pack. Essentially, this will be reading and maths consolidation tasks, using one of the 4 main providers (White Rose Maths, CLPE Power of Reading, ClassroomSecrets, Twinkl) that we use in school.
2. As always, we recommend BBC Bitesize and Oak National Academy, for further online curriculum extension.

3. Where they cannot be provided by the pupils' homes, the school will do its best to provide appropriate materials. Essentials items necessary for pupils to learn e.g. writing materials, rulers, pencils, paper-and work books, can be provided by school.
4. To offer help and advice to parents who request support with the provision of learning at home.
5. Children should only complete the work packs if they are well enough.
6. Children should only complete the work packs if they are in a suitable environment with supportive adults. An exceptional case may be if parents are poorly with Covid, and grandparents are having to look after the children.

The work packs can be collected from school.

If needed they can be delivered to the child's home by staff members.

Review:

If there are future lockdowns or the nature of the pandemic alters again then this policy will be reviewed immediately and further levels of remote learning will be re-established.
